Grace Council Statement on Racism

The events that have unfolded in our nation in recent months have reawakened us to the deep divides that still exist within our country. Racism, manifested in individual acts and present throughout systems, continues to prevent us from being the beloved community that God intends. Our faith in the crucified and risen Christ compels us to speak. We speak against the sin of racism. We speak in solidarity with Black people and all people of color, each of whom is precious to God. We stand with and for Black people within our church and school and in the larger community.

We commit ourselves to following Jesus Christ into the world in the hope that, by the Spirit's power, God's Kingdom would come on earth as it is in heaven. We look with hope and anticipation to a season of growth and change as Grace becomes a more faithful witness to God's wide welcome in Christ. We see this as the beginning, not the end, of the conversation. We pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us, and for the courage to follow.

As We Gather

We wish to see! There are many things we'd love to see more clearly, to know more certainly. When will the pandemic finally end? When will life get back to normal? When will meaningful employment return, or illness go away? We want to see answers to these questions. Perhaps similar questions were on the hearts and minds of these Greeks who wished to see Jesus. Surely this rabbi would give them clarity! Jesus declines to even meet with them, pointing instead to the cross that waits for him. Do you want to see clearly? Look to Christ on his cross, and see the full revelation of God's love for this world, written now even on our hearts. We don't always get the answers we want; the future is not always for us to know. But when we look to the cross, we behold the love of God that holds us in all things.




